ACTIVITY:

TRUCKS AND CHILD SAFETY (TACS)



What is the activity?

An interactive session educating children between the ages of 7 and 11 years old about road safety and the dangers of large vehicles in their local communities, delivered in primary schools across the UK.

Typical activity structure:

- 1. DHL colleagues train to be TACS demonstrators and visit a local primary school
- 2. The colleagues run a fun and interactive session with a group of 30 children
- 3. Children are taught about sight, sounds, and safety highlighting blind spots and visibility from such a large vehicle
- 4. Each session runs for 20-30 minutes per class and the TACS team aim to run multiple sessions in one day

Did you know?

DHL has over 9,000 vehicles on the road. TACS gives DHL drivers and colleagues the perfect opportunity to share their skills and experience to educate young people and other road users on how to behave around large trucks.

Time commitment:

Where: Swindon 1 day at school + 1 day of preparation. Demonstrators are asked to give 3 demonstrations per year.


